



Vehicle Marshall (Vehicle Banksman)

Description of course

Vehicle Marshall is a comprehensive training package covering the dangers and techniques to be employed when manoeuvring vehicles on construction sites. The course has been designed to be highly interactive with theory and practical sessions enabling a thorough knowledge / understanding of carrying out vehicle manoeuvring operations and the associated hazards.

Aims of the training

The aim of this course is to provide delegates with the skills and knowledge necessary to help them avoid having an incident involving the manoeuvring/reversing of vehicles and to enable them to demonstrate safe techniques when carrying out such operations.

Who should attend?

Operatives who are directly involved with carrying out vehicle manoeuvring operations or those who require an appreciation of the dangers and techniques employed whilst working in the vicinity of vehicles.

Course Content

The requirements of a system of work to be employed when manoeuvring vehicles including:

- The legislative requirements
- Practical guidance for operatives
- Vehicle blind spots and pedestrians
- Planning and risk assessing of vehicle routes
- Excavation surcharging due to vehicles and physical controls
- Recognised hand signals
- Encroachment distances for vehicles to overhead power lines (GS6)

Learning outcomes – objectives

The course / training will enable delegates to:

- Identify the hazards that may cause injuries to pedestrians in the workplace.
- Outline the appropriate control measures to reduce the risk of injuries to pedestrians.
- Identify the hazards presented by the movement of vehicles in the workplace.
- Outline the appropriate control measures to reduce the risk from the movement of vehicles.
- Competently manoeuvre a vehicle on site by means of recognised hand signals.
